CLOTHES LIST FOR MIDDLE SCHOOL BOARDERS

It is our expectation that every student is neatly turned out in clean, full School uniform.

Article (Recommended Number)	Notes
<i>1 Blazer</i>	Dark navy blue with navy or silver buttons.
<i>2 Kilts* or trousers</i>	Kilt worn with a pin, hem to be nearer the knee than the hip. Trousers should be full length and smart; solid colour charcoal grey or black. No jeans.
<i>2 Pullovers</i>	V-necked long sleeved or sleeveless, dark navy blue. No zips.
<i>4-5 Shirts</i>	Normal white poly-cotton type. No polo shirts. May be long or short sleeved. Must be able to be tucked in, unless properly tailored. No bare midriffs.
<i>House Tie*</i>	
<i>Socks or Tights</i>	Thick plain navy blue or black tights or navy knee-length or white ankle socks with kilt. Plain black, navy or dark grey socks with trousers.
<i>Pair School Shoes</i>	Must be of formal style and in good repair. They must be black, plain school type, and able to be polished. Ankle boots or long boots may not be worn. Shoes must not be canvas, have buckles, coloured stitching, coloured laces, eyelets or any other adornment, nor may they be of an extravagant style, i.e. no platforms or stiletto heels and a maximum of 2 inch heels.
<i>Mackintosh or Overcoat</i>	All students must possess a plain coat suitable for cold and/or wet weather. It may be dark navy blue, dark grey or black.
<i>Winter Hats</i>	School hat* or plain navy, black or grey.
<i>Scarf</i>	School scarf* or plain navy, black or grey.
<i>Pair Gloves</i>	Navy, black or grey.
<i>Bag or Case</i>	These should be smart and in good repair. Bags with straps over both shoulders are preferable, although briefcases and large sport-style holdall bags are acceptable. Plastic carrier bags and Army surplus bags are not allowed. Suitable bags are

	available from Horncastles.

<i>Casual Clothes</i>	Please note that storage space is limited. These should include garments for slightly more formal occasions, e.g. theatre trips and dinners.
<i>Bedding and Linen</i>	1 laundry bag 1 duvet 1 or 2 pillows 2 sets of bed linen (duvet cover, sheet, pillowcases) 2 bath towels 2 hand towels

Musicians: Students performing in concerts will wear all black, including an ankle length skirt or trousers.

A discount of 5% will be given on the purchase of all school wear at Horncastles during July. If parents use other reputable outfitters they should carefully check the regulations as to the colour and style stipulated in the clothes list regulations.

(As storage space is limited we ask that all boarders keep as closely as possible to the number of personal items on this list).

Hair: Hair must be kept clean, neat and tidy. Long hair must be tied back whilst near the food serveries, during games or in Science labs, for hygiene and safety reasons. All hair bands and ties should be dark and discreet. Hair should not be visibly dyed or bleached; dramatic hair cuts and use of colourants are not acceptable. Headgear may not be worn, unless for religious observance or with the permission of the Divisional Head.

Jewellery: Students may wear one ring, one discreet silver or gold chain and one pair of stud or sleeper earrings in their ear lobes. Natural looking make up and clear or pale-coloured nail varnish are acceptable.

All belongings must be in good repair and clearly and indelibly named. All clothes must be marked (with name tapes and laundry pen), **before arrival**. All other items, including personal effects, must also be clearly and indelibly marked.

All items should be sent in a moderate sized trunk or preferably two medium sized suitcases with wheels. A small suitcase or overnight bag may be useful for weekend leave.

When boarders need to purchase new uniform (not casual clothes) during term time they have the facility to do this from the regular local suppliers, having first obtained a slip giving consent from a member of the Boarding House staff. The charge is then placed on the parents' termly school account.

Differences in the location of Boarding Houses and the age groups accommodated within them inevitably mean there are minor local variations in clothing requirements – numbers of garments, optional extras, etc. Where these exist, parents will be informed of them by the staff of the appropriate Boarding House, to whom enquiries on all such matters should be addressed.
