Read the poem below and answer all the questions. You are advised to use quotations and analysis in support of your answers.

Great City

When I returned at sunset, The serving-maid was singing softly Under the dark stairs, and in the house Twilight had entered like a moon-ray. Tune was so dead I could not understand The meaning of midday or of midnight, But like falling waters, falling, hissing, falling, Silence seemed an everlasting sound.

I sat in my room, And watched sunset, And saw starlight. I heard the tramp of homing men, And the last call of the last child; Then a lone bird twittered, And suddenly, beyond the housetops, I imagined dew in the country, In the hay, on the buttercups; The rising moon, The scent of early night, The songs, the echoes, Dogs barking, Day closing, Gradual slumber, Sweet rest.

When all the lamps were lighted in the town I passed into the street ways and I watched, Wakeful, almost happy, And half the night I wandered in the street.

- 1. What is the significance of the title of the poem? [4 marks]
- 2. How does Harold Monro make us feel sunset is something special? [5 marks]
- 3. How does the poet contrast sound and silence in the poem and to what effect? You are advised to use examples in support of your ideas and explain what they show. [5 marks]
- 4. The poem creates a winding down effect as the day moves to an end. Explain how the poet achieves this. You might want to look at the use of language and structure in support of your ideas. [6 marks]

SECTION B

You should select **one** of the titles below. You are reminded that you will be rewarded for the quality of your ideas and your imagination and accurate use of spelling and punctuation.

EITHER:

1. Continue the poem to describe what Monro sees as he wanders the streets through the night. You may write this either as a poem or prose description. Try to keep the sense of wonder of a night scene as he does in the poem. [20 marks]

2. Write an essay that explores the difference between the city and the countryside. In your writing you might choose to consider, what both locations look like, how they are different as places to live as well as the difference in atmosphere, or any ideas of your own. [20 marks]
