Welcome to Music at Sevenoaks School.

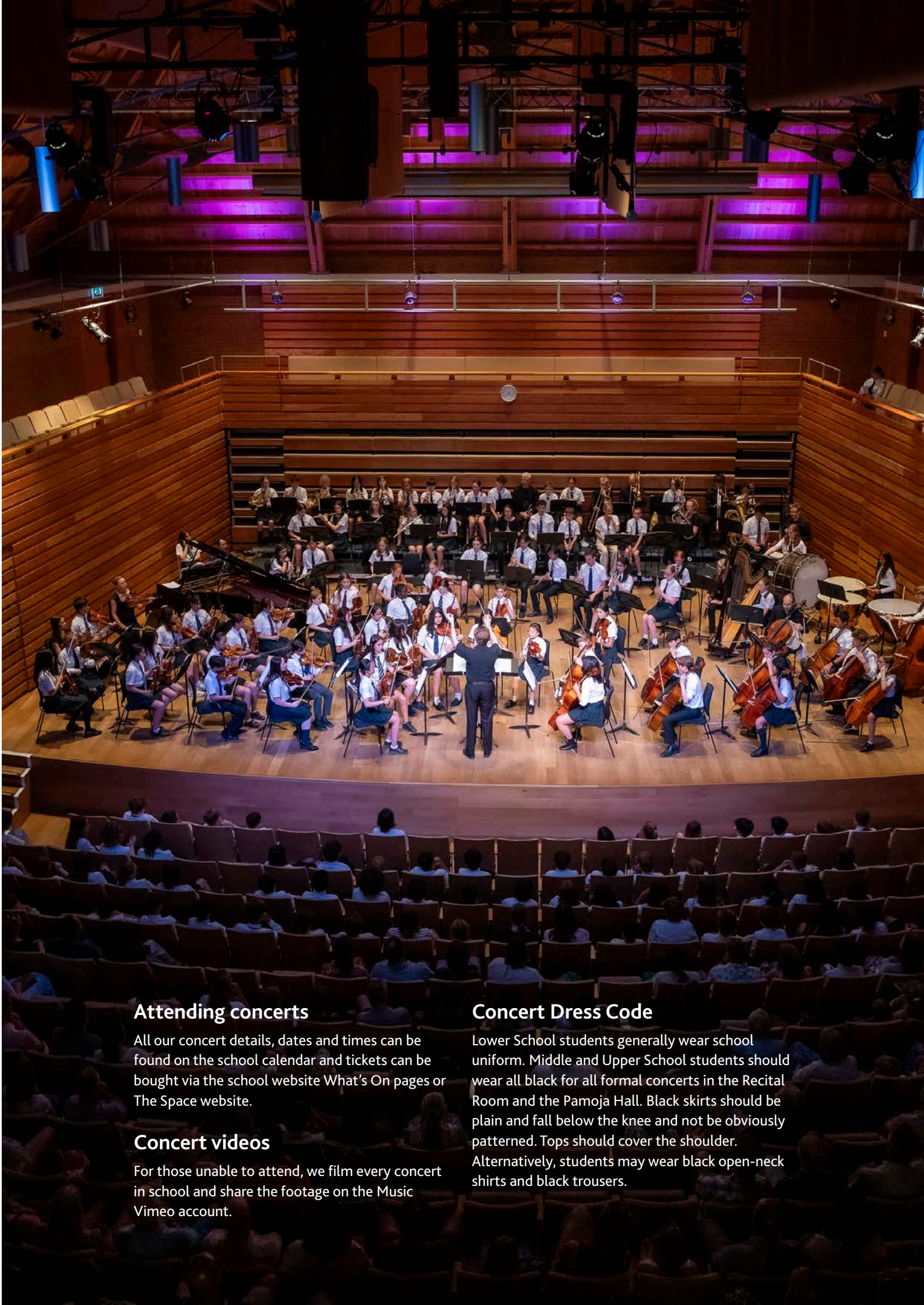

## Concert Dress Code

Lower School students generally wear school uniform. Middle and Upper School students should wear all black for all formal concerts in the Recital Room and the Pamoja Hall. Black skirts should be plain and fall below the knee and not be obviously patterned. Tops should cover the shoulder. Alternatively, students may wear black open-neck shirts and black trousers.



## The Music Co-curriculum

The Music department runs a busy and thriving programme of activities outside the academic curriculum, including the following large ensembles:

- Symphony Orchestra (older students).
- Foundation Orchestra (younger students).
- Wind Band
- Sevenoaks Strings
- Big Band
- Jazz Band

The following choirs exist for both classical and contemporary vocalists:

Smaller ensembles and clubs include chamber music, jazz, composition, songwriting and contemporary music.

## Individual Music Lessons

Sevenoaks School offers music tuition on all standard orchestral instruments as well as in piano, organ, harp, recorder, saxophone, guitar (classical and electric/bass), percussion and voice. Alexander Technique lessons are also available. If you wish your child to start an individual music lesson, please contact the department administrator, Mrs Suzy Parkin, for more information.

Instrumental lessons are usually 30 minutes in length. Fees for 2024-25 are £36 for a half-hour lesson (£972 for 27 half-hour lessons) and are charged to your next school bill. The hire charge for use of musical instruments is £63 per term.

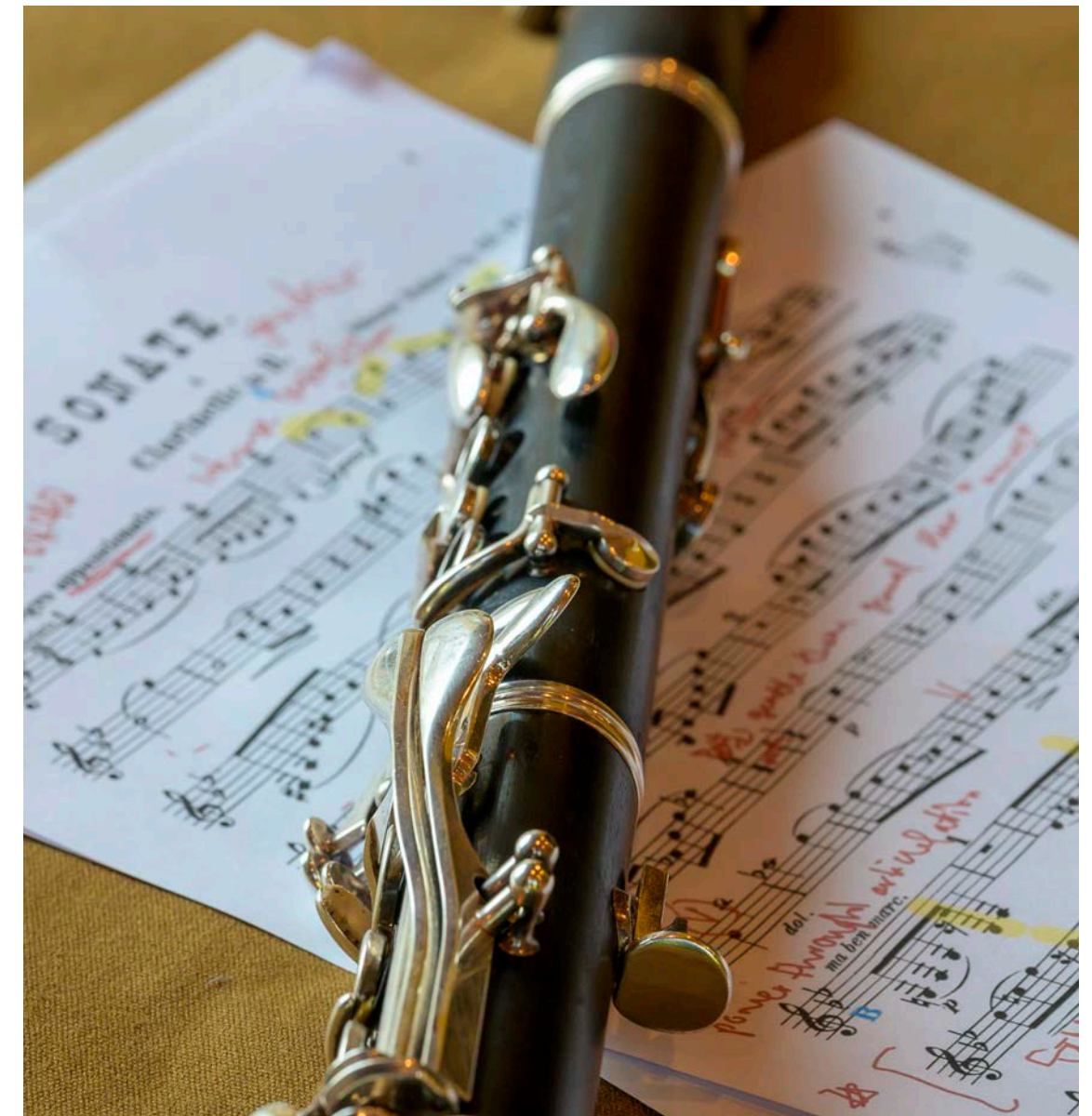


The school offers free tuition in the following instruments for beginners in their first term at the school: French horn, trombone, euphonium, tuba, oboe, bassoon, double bass, organ, bass guitar and harp.

Sixth Form students take their music lessons in free periods or outside of class time, as far as possible. Students in Year 11 and below will need to miss a part of an academic lesson at a time which they agree with the instrumental teacher in the previous lesson. Great care is taken to avoid clashes and conflicts with academic tests. Music lesson times are located on SOCS and are a commitment once the lesson time is agreed between teacher and pupil.

Every student receives two reports per year at the same time as their academic report. These will give parents and students an indication of their level as well as a positive indication of their achievements, what they have been working on and what they have recently mastered, as well as an indication of what they now need to do to move their playing level on and increase their enjoyment.

Notice to stop instrumental lessons is requested by email by half term in order for lessons to cease at the end of that term.



## Musical Instruments

Instruments brought into school MUST be named.

Shared instrumental lockers are provided for all students, who each have their own key.

Sharing instruments is not allowed. Instruments must be returned to their lockers after use.

The school has a small stock of instruments that may be hired, subject to availability.

These instruments are not suitable for advanced players, and are usually hired for a maximum of one school year.

Please make sure that your child takes their instrument and music home in the holidays. A small amount of practice during the long holidays is a good idea.

## Music Examinations

The school provides examinations for students regularly throughout the year, subject to the examination uptake being sufficient for the boards to send us an examiner. We expect to make entries through The Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music (late September, early December, late January, early March and mid-June), Trinity College London (towards the end of each term) and the London College of Music (end of May). A fee is payable, which is charged to your school bill. The school provides an accompanist for exams taken in school at these times.

Most examinations take place live, in front of an examiner. However, the opportunity does exist to take exams remotely. More information on these exams is available on request.





## Our Expectations...

### Of ourselves

- To provide a varied and high standard programme of groups, rehearsals and concerts that are generally open to every student in the school.
- To have excellent and inspiring teachers, groups and music-making.
- To enable opportunities for student growth and challenge.
- To communicate rehearsals and performances efficiently and suitably in advance.

### Of students

- Punctual attendance and a positive attitude.
- Honesty, cooperation and communication (in advance please!)
- A commitment to their ensemble or group until the next performance.
- To sustain a regular practice schedule. A little and often is better than large amounts of time once or twice only during the week.
- Pride with that which is worthy, endeavour and perseverance with that which is problematic, and a willingness to move on when it hasn't quite worked out – yet!

### Of parents

- Support and encouragement of students in their pursuit of music-making, so they attend rehearsals and commitments. Learning an extensive piece of music (such as an orchestral or choral piece) takes time and dedication, but is always worth it.
- Communication with your child about their musical development (and please attend their concerts if you are able).
- Checking that your child has brought their musical instrument home in the holidays.
- Communication with the department about your child, if you feel necessary.

Should there be matters arising over the course of the year which need resolving, please email or call Mrs Parkin, and she can put you in contact with the necessary people.

We look forward to welcoming you to any of the musical events at Sevenoaks School.



## FAQ

### What do I do if...?

#### My child's instrument is missing

Contact the department administrator, Mrs Parkin, who will help your child to find the instrument. Check that the instrument is named.

#### My child does not know when the next lesson is

Ask them to look on SOCS. If they cannot find it, ask Mrs Parkin, who will advise further.

#### I think my school bill is inaccurate

Email Mrs Parkin who will ask the music teacher to verify the number of lessons charged for.

#### My child seems to be getting no work

In the first instance, ask to see the music notebook, or target sheet. If this still leaves cause for concern, contact the relevant music teacher on the email at the end of this document.

#### My child does not seem to know what to practise

It is best to email the music teacher but copy the email to Mrs Ashwell and to your child's form tutor, who will discuss the matter with your child as well.

#### I did not receive an instrumental report with my last school report

Contact your child's form tutor.

#### I am not satisfied with the progress being made

In the first instance, contact the music teacher with your concerns. If you are not happy with the matter, you should then contact Mrs Ashwell, who will investigate further.

#### How do I request lessons of a length other than 30 minutes, once a week?

You should contact Mrs Parkin, who will inform the relevant teachers and ask them to discuss this with you. To receive more than 30 minutes, a student needs to have reached a reasonably advanced level.
